### MEASURES IN FORCE - updated on 28 June:

#### GENERAL PROTECTIVE MEASURES - PROTECTIVE MASKS

1. Mandatory wearing of protective masks for:

- employees and patients in public and private health care institutions;
- employees in public and private institutions of social and child protection for the accommodation of children, adults and the elderly;
- employees in state bodies, state administration bodies, administrative bodies, local self - government bodies, public institution and other entities that exercise public authority and in which services are directly provided to citizens;
- employees and users of services in cultural institutions (libraries, archives, museums and galleries);
- persons in religious facilities, except for religious officials who participate in performance of religious rites;
- employees and users of services in counter halls of state bodies, state administration bodies, local administration bodies, banks, post offices and other legal entities, where work with citizens is carried out;
- employees and passengers in public transport vehicles (airplane, train, bus, van, taxi - vehicle) and during their stay in the airport building, bus and train stations, as well as during the transport of employees with vehicles for their own needs;
- drivers and passengers in a passenger motor vehicle (except for a members of a common family household);
- employees in catering facilities (restaurants, cafes, cafeterias, hotel restaurants and similar catering facilities), including employees who provide catering services on beaches and bathing areas;
- employees and consumers/visitors in trade facilities (markets, supermarkets, hypermarkets, shopping malls, etc.), including sellers and consumers in green markets and indoor stands/ stalls;
- employees who perform construction works, during their organised transportation to and from construction site, as well as during their staying and working on the construction site (except during food consumption, at the time set for meals);
- chief, responsible and other engineers, while executing the construction works indoors;
- employees and users of services in facilities that provide artisanal services, servicing and maintenance of equipment, tools, devices, motor vehicles, construction and agricultural machinery, as well as vehicles road - worthiness testing;
- employees and users of services in facilities where hairdressing and cosmetic services are provided. In case the user is provided with the service of shaving or cosmetic treatment on the face, when user does not wear a mask, the employee is obliged to wear a visor or glasses in addition to the protective mask, in accordance with the instructions of Public Health Institute of Montenegro;
- employees and players in facilities where game of chance are organised (casinos, bookmakers, gambling casinos);
- employees and users of services in facilities where car rental is performed (rent - a car);
- employees and users of services in the premises for theoretical classes and taking the theoretical part of the driving test (driving school).

Employers are obliged to provide employees with protective masks, during work in facilities, premises and vehicles.

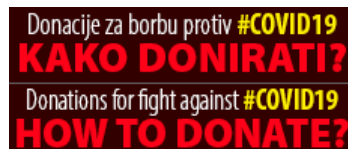
#### PUBLIC GATHERINGS

2. Political rallies in open public places are prohibited;
3. The presence of spectators at sports events is prohibited;
4. Religious gatherings in open public places except on the property of the religious facilities are prohibited; and
5. Funerals are conducted with immediate family only.
6. Public gatherings indoors can be attended by a **maximum of 200 people** with the obligation to respect the social distance of at least two meters and other recommendations in accordance with the relevant instructions of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro.

#### INTERNAL TRAFFIC AND TRAVELLING

7. **Internal road, rail and maritime traffic** is carried out with the application of preventive measures, in accordance with the instructions of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro.

Instruction for maritime transport: mandatory wearing of protective masks, without possibility of standing in vessel.

Employees and passengers in public transport vehicles (plane, train, bus, van, taxi) are required to wear protective masks.

#### INTERNATIONAL TRAFFIC, TRAVELLING AND ENTRY INTO MONTENEGRO

8. **State employees and employed in state bodies, state administration bodies, administrative bodies and state employees in local - self government bodies are prohibited from traveling abroad**, except in cases where the trip is of state interest with the prior consent of the head of the authority.

9. **Arrangements of all student tours, educational meetings etc. abroad is prohibited.**

10. **International rail passenger traffic is suspended.**

11. **International road, maritime and air traffic is performed with countries and across the territory of countries from the 'green list' as follows:** Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia.

**Note: This list of countries is valid as of 29 June 2020. Montenegro will align its further opening policy with that of the European Union as soon as the EU announces its policy.**

12. **Off - line traffic** with countries that are not on the green list, is performed so the group of passengers transported from the departure point to the destination point, is determined in advance. The passing entry/exit of passengers is excluded.

#### ENTRY INTO MONTENEGRO - NATIONALS OF MONTENEGRO AND FOREIGNERS RESIDING IN MONTENEGRO

13. Entrance to Montenegro is ensured for every citizen of Montenegro and a foreigner with permanent or temporary residence in Montenegro, regardless of the country from which they enter Montenegro, with the following conditions:

- **Without additional restrictions**, when they enter Montenegro from any of the countries included in the list of countries and if in a period from the 15th day before entering Montenegro to the day of entry, they did not stay in any of the countries or travel through any of the countries outside the list of countries ('green list') namely: Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia.

**Note: This list of countries is valid as of 29 June 2020. Montenegro will align its further opening policy with that of the European Union as soon as the EU announces its policy.**

- **With the negative PCR or ELISA test for COVID-19**, which is no older than 72 hours, if they enter from any of countries on the list and in the period from the 15th day before entering Montenegro to the day of entry, while they did not stay in any of country or traveled through one of the countries **out of the previous list and this list of countries ('yellow list')**: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Turkey, Israel, Poland, Romania, Italy and Ukraine.

**Citizen of Montenegro and a foreigner with permanent or temporary residence in Montenegro, if enters Montenegro from one of the countries out of the previous two lists of countries, or if in the period from the 15th day before entry to the day of entry, he stayed in one of the countries or traveled through any of the countries, out of the previous two lists, upon entering are put in quarantine or self-isolation for a period of 14 days.**

#### ENTRY TO MONTENEGRO - CITIZENS OF MONTENEGRO - EXCEPTION - SEAFARERS

14. Seafarers who disembark in one of the countries from the next 'green list' and pass exclusively through the countries from the list when traveling to Montenegro, are not put to quarantine or self - isolation, upon arrival in Montenegro. According to the assessment of the competent epidemiologist and in accordance with the provisions of the Law on the Protection of Population against Communicable Diseases, they can be sampled and tested for the novel coronavirus, if necessary. The 'Green list' includes: Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia.

Seafarers who **disembark in the the countries of the 'green list' and in transit pass or stay in countries not included in this list after disembarkation, and seafarers who disembark in countries not included in 'green list'** are placed in institutional quarantine for seven days, upon arrival in Montenegro, after which they can be transferred to home self-isolation, until 14 days from their arrival expires.

**Note: This list of countries is valid as of 29 June 2020. Montenegro will align its further opening policy with that of the European Union as soon as the EU announces its policy.**

#### ENTRY TO MONTENEGRO - FOREIGNERS

15. **Foreigner national is allowed** to enter Montenegro with the following conditions:

- **Without additional restrictions** if he is a resident of one of the countries from the list, if he enters Montenegro from one of the countries on the list, and if in the period from the 15th day before entering Montenegro to the day of entry he did not stay in any of the countries not included in the list of countries, namely: Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia.

- With the negative PCR or ELISA test for COVID-19, **which is not older than 72 hours, if foreign national is resident or enters from any of the countries of the list, and if in the period from the 15th day before entering Montenegro to the day of entry, he did not stay in any of the country or travel through one of the countries outside the previous list and the following list of countries:** Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Turkey, Israel, Poland, Romania, Italy and Ukraine.

**It is not possible for residents of countries off the previous two lists to enter Montenegro** unless they have proof (stamp in the passport) that they have spent the past 15 days until the day of entering Montenegro in one of the countries on the "green list" (Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia) and that they did not visit countries off this list during that period.

**NOTE: Upon entry, the country of which the person is a resident is observed, not the country of which the person is a national if it is not the same country. For example: A citizen of a country off the list with a regular residence in the country on the list is treated as a citizen of the country on the list because he or she is a resident of the country on the list.**

#### ENTRY TO MONTENEGRO - EXCEPTION - CERTAIN CATEGORIES OF PERSONS

16. In accordance with the recommendation of the European Commission, certain categories of persons necessary for normal functioning of vital services and employees who represent a clear economic interest are excluded from the stated criteria. Special conditions for entry and movement through Montenegro, the Public Health Institute prescribes for:

- Health workers, health researches and scientists;
- Persons who perform or provide transport of passengers and goods;
- Diplomats, staff of international organisations, military personnel and humanitarian aid workers in performing their functions;
- Certain categories of passengers in transit;
- Persons in need of international protection or coming to Montenegro for other humanitarian reasons (the principle of non refoulement is respected).

#### ENTRY TO MONTENEGRO - EXCEPTION - GENERAL AVIATION

17. Foreigner citizens coming by non commercial air traffic are allowed to enter Montenegro, regardless of which country they come from, while complying with following temporary measures:

**If the aircraft arrives from one of the countries from the 'green list',** namely: Algeria, Angola, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brunei, Bulgaria, Cambodia, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Iceland, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Malaysia, Morocco, Mauritius, Monaco, Mongolia, Mozambique, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Philippines, Seychelles, Senegal, South Korea, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Tajikistan, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uruguay, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia, **there will be no additional restrictions on entry.**

If the aircraft comes from one of the countries outside the previous list, passengers and the crew must have a negative PCR or ELISA test for COVID-19, which is not older than 72 hours, when entering Montenegro. Health surveillance measures are taken against these passengers after entering Montenegro, in accordance with the recommendations of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro. For the arrival/departure of passengers from the passenger terminal to the accommodation, it is necessary to organise special transport, in line with the recommendations of the Public Health Institute.

While staying in a hotel or other accommodation, passengers are obliged to apply the recommendations of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro.

**Note: This list of countries is valid as of 29 June 2020. Montenegro will align its further opening policy with that of the European Union as soon as the EU announces its policy.**

## TRANSIT OF RESIDENTS OF BIH, KOSOVO AND ALBANIA THROUGH MONTENEGRO

18. The transit of residents of the countries from the 'yellow list' (Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosova, Albania) through Montenegro between the countries of the yellow list is enabled without obligation of having a PCR or ELISA test for COVID-19.

Transit is enabled with the control on the time of entering into Montenegro, passage of checkpoints and exiting Montenegro, without staying in Montenegro.

## BORDER CROSSINGS

19. All border crossings for entry into Montenegro are open, except for the following road border crossings:

- **Vračenovići (Montenegro) - Deleuša (Bosnia and Herzegovina)** on the road **Nikšić - Bileća**, which was closed on 27 February due to the construction of border infrastructure;

- **Vuča (Montenegro) - Godovo (Republic of Serbia)** on the road **Rožaje - Tutin**, which was closed on 20 June, in order to suppress the transmission of coronavirus from the Republic of Serbia.

20. **Entry of passengers** from Bosnia and Herzegovina to Montenegro is **NOT ALLOWED**, through the border crossings **Šćepan Polje (Montenegro) - Hum (Bosnia and Herzegovina)**, on the road **Plužine - Foča**, and **Meteljka (Montenegro) - Meteljka (Bosnia and Herzegovina)** on the road **Pljevlja - Čajanče**.

Passengers coming out of Montenegro and transport of goods are enabled at these border crossing points, in both directions.

## TRAFFIC AND TRANSIT OF GOODS

21. The traffic of goods for the needs of Montenegro and transit remains smooth, with particular measures of health supervision, in accordance with the recommendations of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro.

## VISITING PERSONS IN HOSPITALS

22. **Ban on visiting persons who are receiving hospital treatment in healthcare institutions and persons accommodated in social and childcare institutions.**

## SPORTS AND RECREATION

23. Training of athletes (amateur athletes, professional athletes and recreational athletes) and sport competitions and tournaments for athletes in sports facilities (indoor and outdoor sports facilities - fields and swimming pools) are organised without the presence of spectators / fans, in a way that owners and users of sports facilities and sports organisations are obliged to ensure the application of temporary measures, as follows:

- Mandatory disinfection equipment for training, competitions, tournaments and items that are shared by athletes, in accordance with recommendations of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro;

- Compliance with personal hygiene measures - regular hand hygiene, before and after the completed sports activity.

## BATHING AREAS AND BEACHES

24. Companies, other legal entities entrepreneurs engaged in the provision of tourist services at bathing areas and beaches are required to comply with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro](#). (in Montenegrin)

25. Users of **non - regulated bathing areas** are obliged to respect the distance of at least 2 m, except for members of joint family household.

## HEALTH

26. In private and public health institutions, employees and patients are obliged to wear protective masks.

27. **Dental practices** are obliged to organise work in such a way as to provide a system of mandatory patient scheduling, to ensure that only **one patient** can stay in the waiting room (**on 10 square metres**) at the time, while respecting the social distance of at least 2 m between patients, to provide **hand sanitizers to patients when entering/leaving the practice** and to ensure that all employees follow work procedures and **wear personal protective equipment**, in accordance with the recommendations of the Public Health Institute and the Dental Chamber of Montenegro.

28. Other health care institutions are obliged to:

- ensure that all patients wear protective masks during their stay in the health institution (provided that the patients clinical condition allows the wearing of the mask and that the mask does not compromise the patients respiratory function) and ensure respect for social distance of at least two meters between patients;

- prominently display a notice on valid temporary measures for prevention and control of the novel coronavirus in the health institution;

- provide hand sanitizer to patients at the entrance/exit of the health institution;

## EDUCATION

29. Educational work in public and private educational institutions has been suspended, **except in preschool institutions** which are obliged to organise work in accordance with the [Instruction of Public Health Institute of Montenegro for kindergartens and preschool institutions](#). (in Montenegrin)

30. **Music schools, foreign language schools, adult education institutions and halls of residence** are obliged to organise their work in accordance with the corresponding instructions of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro.

#### Economy and entrepreneurship - tourism and catering industries

31. Obligation of companies, other legal entities and entrepreneurs performing catering activities in catering facilities (**restaurants, cafes, cafeterias, hotel restaurants and similar catering facilities**) including the provision of catering facilities at beaches and bathing areas, to organise their work in accordance with corresponding instructions of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro:

#### Economy and entrepreneurship - trade

32. Owner/ user and manager of **trade facilities**, entrepreneurs who **provide artisanal and other services** are obliged to organise their work, in accordance with corresponding instructions of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro:

33. **Operators of games of chance** are obliged to organise their work, in accordance with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#).

#### AGRICULTURE

34. Persons performing agricultural activity are obliged to comply with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#)

#### COUNTER SERVICES (STATE ADMINISTRATION, BANKS, POST OFFICES etc.)

35. State authorities, state and local government bodies, banks, post offices and other legal entities are obliged to organise work in **counter halls**, in accordance with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#)

#### LIBRARIES, MUSEUMS, GALLERIES etc.

36. Cultural institutions (**libraries, archives, museums and galleries**) are obliged to organise work, in accordance with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#)

#### DRIVING SCHOOLS

37. Legal entities that train drivers (**driver schools**) are obliged to organise work, in accordance with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#)

#### RENT - A - CAR

38. Legal entities and entrepreneurs, providing **car - rental services** are obliged to organise work, in accordance with corresponding [Instruction of the Public Health Institute of Montenegro \(in Montenegrin\)](#)

#### CONSTRUCTION

39. Companies, other legal entities or entrepreneurs who carry out the construction work and are responsible for the execution of construction works on the facility, i.e. for the execution of certain works are obliged to:

- Ensure adherence to epidemiological measures, especially respecting the **social distance between employees and other measures to ensure health protection**;
- **Put notice, in a conspicuous place on the construction site, on the temporary prevention and control measures against the novel coronavirus**;
- **Prohibit all employees** who carry out construction work on the construction site, during working hours, **from leaving the construction site to procure food, etc**;
- **Provide food delivery to employees performing construction work on the construction site**;
- **Ensure social distance during the organised transportation of employees from and to the construction site (bus or van)**.

#### STATE ADMINISTRATION - DOCUMENTS

40. State authorities, state administration bodies, local self - government bodies and local governments are obliged to consider **expired personal documents** issued after 2008 (**identity card, passport and drivers license**), held by citizens, on the basis of which they exercise their rights or fulfill their obligations before these authorities, as **valid**. (**The measure is valid until 1 July 2020**).

41. Competent authorities that control and regulate the traffic on the roads are obliged to consider **expired traffic licenses as valid until 1 July 2020**, if the driver, along the license, possesses a valid insurance policy and proof of performed technical inspection of the vehicle.

42. State authorities, public administration bodies, local self - government and local administration authority, companies, public institutions and other legal persons, entrepreneurs and natural persons are obliged to **consider expired permanent residence permit, temporary residence permit and temporary residence and work permit of foreigners**, on the basis of which they exercise their rights or fulfill their obligations before these authorities, **as valid until 1 July 2020**.

#### TEMPORARY SPECIAL MEASURES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ROŽAJE

43. The border crossing Vuča - Godovo on the road route Rožaje (Montenegro) - Tutin (Serbia) is closed;

44. It is forbidden for all residents of the municipality of Rožaje to leave the residential building from 18:00 to 05:00 the next day; and

45. Work of catering facilities is allowed until 17:00.

#### SPECIAL TEMPORARY SPECIAL MEASURES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ROŽAJE AND BIJELO POLJE

46. Gatherings in indoor and outdoor public places are prohibited (public gatherings, public events, sports, political, cultural, artistic and private gatherings, weddings, as well as other events);

47. Religious communities are obliged to adapt their activities to the current epidemiological situation and to perform religious rites in religious facilities only and without the presence of citizens;

48. It is prohibited to transport more than two adults in a passenger vehicle at the same time, except for members of the joint family household and persons performing regular work tasks;

49. Movement and loitering of more than two persons in an open public place is prohibited, except for members of the joint family household and persons performing regular work tasks;

50. It is obligatory to use protective masks in closed and open public places. This obligation does not apply to residential buildings;

51. Gatherings in residential building by persons who are not members of a joint family household are prohibited; and

52. Work of preschool education institutions is suspended.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Citizens of Rožaje are recommended not to leave the territory of the municipality unless necessary.
