## COVID-19 DAILY ADVISORY - SATURDAY, MARCH 28, 2020

There have been no new positive cases of COVID-19 recorded since Prime Minister's announcement on Wednesday 25 March 2020. There are currently 5 cases of COVID-19 confirmed in Fiji. The Fijian Government will advise the public as soon as this changes.

There are 32 Fever Clinics now fully operational throughout Fiji, while nine more clinics will be opened in the coming days. In an effort to stop the spread of COVID-19, the Fijian Ministry of Health and Medical Services is encouraging people to visit these fever clinics if they feel that they are developing any symptoms of COVID-19.

At the fever clinics, people will have their temperatures taken and symptoms checked. The symptoms are dry cough, fever and sore throat. They will also be asked if they have travelled to a country that has recorded positive COVID-19 cases in the last 14 days or have been in contact with someone who had tested positive for COVID-19.

Based on a this thorough analysis, Health Care Workers will then direct individuals for further testing or they will be referred to health centres for common colds and related ailments.

These Clinics are open from 8am to 4pm, 7 days a week, with the Lautoka based clinics having extended hours of operation from 8am to 10pm.

The clinic based at the Valelevu Health Center is open 24 hours a day.

### What can I do to protect myself?

- Clean your hands regularly and thoroughly with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth and don't spit, share bilos or cigarettes.
- Maintain at least one-metre distance between yourself and others.
- Always cover your mouth with a tissue or elbow when coughing or sneezing. Dispose off the tissue properly.
